About Dayton History & Carillon Historical Park

Dayton History brings the past to life with passion and pride in our region's creative heritage. Dayton History is the recognized regional historical organization that collects, preserves, interprets, presents and promotes the region's assets, stories and experiences. We offer quality interpretive and educational programming in order to help local residents understand what it means to be a Daytonian, and to help people everywhere know the enormous impact creative Daytonians have had, and continue to have, on the nation and the world. The organization boasts multiple campuses in the greater Dayton, Ohio area: Carillon Historical Park, Old River Park, the Paul Laurence Dunbar House, the Patterson Homestead, and the Archive Center. In 2007 we began operating tours of Hawthorn Hill, home of the Orville Wright, in partnership with the Wright Family Foundation.

Carillon Historical Park is the keystone of Dayton History, with 30 historical buildings and countless artifacts on display. Founded by Colonel Edward and his wife Edith Deeds in 1942, the Park is situated on a beautiful 65-acre campus between the Great Miami River and a glacial moraine. The park shares the region's history from Dayton's founding in 1796 through the important local contributions made during World War II. Among the Park's artifacts is the 1905 Wright Flyer III, the world's first practical airplane and National Historic Landmark, named the Best Historical Artifact by Ohio Magazine. Other highlights include the 1835 B&O (Grasshopper) steam locomotive and the first automobile self-starter. The park is also home to its namesake, the Deeds Carillon, one of Dayton's best-known landmarks and the largest carillon in Ohio.

The fifth annual Dayton Concours d'Elegance at Carillon Park will begin at 10:30 AM on Sunday, September 18th. Examine and admire 200 of the finest classic and antique automobiles and motorcycles in the country, amidst the beautiful and welcoming setting of the region's premier outdoor museum. This year's event will feature the Cars of the Roarin' 20's, The race cars of the Indianapolis 500 and 100 Year Old Cars, nestled among the historical buildings and exhibits of Carillon Historical Park. Guests will be treated to live music, historical demonstrations and food vendors in addition to the chance to see beautiful cars and motorcycles up close and personal.

The event will culminate with an awards ceremony around 3:00PM. Winners of the "Best in Class" awards will parade to the awards area, followed by the winners of the R.H. Grant Best in Show, Charles Kettering People's Choice, Col. Edward Deeds Judge's Choice, Jeffrey Siler Spirit Award, Taj Ma Garaj Award, and Kid's Choice Awards.

Admission is \$10 for adults and \$5 for children ages 3-17, with Dayton History members and children under 3 admitted free. Each admission includes full access to all of the buildings and exhibits of Carillon Historical Park, as well as a souvenir event program.
